The result of the Class-X main examination 2025-2026 conducted by CBSE has been declared today. The following is informed to the stakeholders:-

1. RESULTS ON NET

2. Mobile App (Available both on Android & iOS)

DIGILOCKER APP

- Students can download DigiLocker mobile app from Google Play (<http://play.google.com/store/apps/details?id=com.digilocker.android>) or Apple Store (<https://apps.apple.com/in/app/digilocker/id1320618078>) to access their certificates.

UMANG APP

- Students can download Umang mobile app from Google Play (<https://play.google.com/store/apps/details?id=in.gov.umang.negd.g2c>) or iOS (<http://apps.apple.com/in/app/umang/id1236448857?platform=iphone>) to access their result.



3. Digital academic documents through DigiLocker-

- CBSE will provide Digital Academic Documents viz. Mark-Sheet cum Certificates, Migration Certificates and Skill Certificates (wherever applicable) through its own digital academic repository "Parinam Manjusha" immediately after the declaration of result. <https://cbse.digitallocker.gov.in/>
- CBSE is also giving access to schools on CBSE's academic repository – Parinam Manjusha to download the Digital Academic Documents of their students through DigiLocker. Schools can log in at <https://cbse.digitallocker.gov.in/> by clicking Sign in option using login credentials already shared by CBSE.
- Digilocker access has also been extended to the students of CBSE affiliated schools abroad. The students of these schools can access their Digital academic documents via Digilocker in following ways.

Press Note

CBSE DECLARES CLASS X EXAMINATION RESULTS 2026

The Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE), one of the largest Boards globally in terms of student participation, has successfully conducted the Class X examinations for its affiliated schools in India and abroad. With affiliations in 27 countries, ranging from Japan to Ghana, CBSE continues to uphold its commitment to transparency and safe examination practices.

At the Class X level, CBSE offers 84 subjects, the highest number among any national or international board. Examinations are conducted worldwide at Indian Standard Time, ensuring uniformity and fairness.

KEY HIGHLIGHTS OF 2026 EXAMINATIONS

- **Dual Examination System:** In line with the recommendations of the National Education Policy (NEP), CBSE introduced two Board examinations for Class X students this year. The first examination was held in February–March, and the second is scheduled for May.
- **Mandatory Participation:** Students were required to appear in at least three subjects during the first examination, which serves as the main examination.
- **Early Result Declaration:** Traditionally, Class X results are announced in mid-May. However, this year, CBSE evaluated approximately 1.6 crore answer books in record time. The

results are being declared on **15th April 2026**, nearly a month earlier than usual.

- **Second Examination:** Following the declaration of results, students will be asked to submit their candidature for the second examination through their respective schools. A separate circular will be issued to guide this process.

SPECIAL CONSIDERATION FOR WEST ASIAN STUDENTS

Given the prevailing situation in West Asian countries, CBSE has decided to release the results of students from this region simultaneously with other students, ensuring fairness and consistency in accordance with CBSE policy.

EXAMINATION FOR THE STUDENTS WHO PARTICIPATED IN NATIONAL/ INTERNATIONAL SPORTS EVENTS

This year, as per policy of two Board Examinations, such students will be allowed to appear in the Second Board Examinations.

PREPARATION OF DATE SHEET

In CBSE, students can offer any combination of subjects. Accordingly, more than 25000 subject combinations were offered by the students in 2025-26 session. CBSE has declared date sheet this time much in advance as per the following details:-

1. First date Sheet was issued on 20 Oct, 2025 i.e. 109 days before the start of examinations
2. Final date sheet with minor correction was issued on 31 Dec, 2025 i.e. 47 days before the start of examinations.
3. Sufficient time was given between two examinations offered by the students.
4. Examinations were also schedule in such a manner that evaluation is over in shortest time after the examinations are over.

CBSE is updating its system to extend benefits to the students to enhance their learning. Advance date sheets have helped students in better planning

for preparations of examinations. Also, schools and teachers were also able to plan well to support the students in the preparations of the examinations.

DEVELOPING STANDARD OPERATING PROCEDURES

To ensure that all the activities of the examinations are simpler and well comprehended in the new examination environment where two Board examinations will be conducted, CBSE has revised all Standard Operating Procedures and provided to all concerned.

ORIENTATION OF SCHOOLS

For holding examinations successfully, a very minute and detailed policy is prepared for the examination centres, school sponsoring the students for Boards examinations, for the parents and the students.

To ensure that this policy is followed by all correctly, a live webinar was conducted by the CBSE for all its affiliated schools on 13.02.2026. This webinar was attended by more than 30000 schools and their teachers teaching classes from Class IX to Class XII. Total number of persons watched this live webinar were more than 4 Lakh.

In this webinar, important information regarding conduct of examinations and evaluation was communicated and the queries of participants were also cleared.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Frequently Asked Questions were also developed for functionaries involved in the conduct of examinations and provided to them for better understanding of the rules and regulations for the smooth conduct of examinations.

COMPARING THE PERFORMANCE OF THIS BATCH

This year, the pass percentage of students in class X is 93.70%, which is better than pass percentage of last year i.e.93.66% of 2025 examination. This confirms that students are well prepared for competency based assessment.

FEEDBACK DURING THE CONDUCT OF THE EXAMINATION

Board has developed a very strong offline and online feedback system to get feedback on the question papers. Appropriate action has been taken by the Board on the basis of such feedback during the preparation of results.

BIGGEST EXAMINATION ON A SINGLE DAY

On 21.02.2026, CBSE conducted examinations of 24,95,022 candidates which was the biggest examination conducted in a single day. More than 10 lakh rooms and 20 lakh invigilators were used on this day.

AVAILABILITY OF DOCUMENTS AFTER RESULT DECLARATION

Regular students in India

1. This year, performance of the students in the main examinations will be made available in their DigiLocker account.
2. Final result will be declared after the conduct of Second Board Examinations.
3. Grading will also be calculated by combining the result of both Main and Second Board Examinations.
4. To avoid the problem of accessing the DigiLocker, CBSE has provided the PIN to the schools in advance, to be given to the candidates ahead of the result declaration. Students can log in to their DigiLocker either by using their PIN or with their Aadhaar number.
5. Further, the Board will supply Printed Mark sheets cum Passing Certificates to the students through their schools only after second Board Examinations.

Regular students in Foreign Countries

Foreign students can also get their digital documents on their emails through the CBSE DigiLocker page. Their Printed Marksheets cum Passing Certificates will be supplied through their schools.

To the private students

1. Private students will also be provided electronic documents in their DigiLocker which could be accessed through their Aadhaar number.
2. Except for the students of the Regional Office, Delhi East and Delhi West, printed documents will be sent to the address given in the examination form. For the students of Delhi East and Delhi West, printed documents will be available at the examination centre from where they have appeared in the examinations.

NO MERIT LIST

As per the earlier decision of the Board to avoid unhealthy competition amongst the students, no merit list is declared by the CBSE. Also, Board does not award first, second or third divisions to its students.

However, the Board will issue the merit certificate to top 0.1% of students who have scored the highest marks in the subjects. The Merit certificate will be made available in the Digi-Locker of the student concerned after second Board examinations.

VERIFICATION, PHOTOCOPY, AND RE-EVALUATION

Though, the CBSE has a well developed and reliable system of evaluation, however, CBSE provides a transparent policy where in students who are not satisfied with their performance informed in result may avail the following facilities: -

- 1. They can obtain the Photocopy (Scanned copy) of their answer book**
- 2. Verification of marks or Re-evaluation or both**

These facilities can only be availed online and will be made available only after second board examinations.

IMPROVEMENT OPPORTUNITY IN THE SECOND BOARD EXAMINATIONS

As per the Two Board Examination Policy, second Board examinations are proposed to start from mid May. In this regard a circular has already been issued and available on website.

LOC SUBMISSION FOR SECOND BOARD EXAMINATIONS

Candidates who wish to improve their performance after passing main examinations and candidates who are placed in compartment category in the main examinations-2026, LOC will start from 16.04.2026 only for 5 days.

SPECIAL SUPPORT AND APPRECIATION

Conducting Board examinations for Classes X is the second biggest exercise after Parliament Elections in the country. The volume of the examinations could be seen from the statistics given above. Such mega exercise cannot be completed successfully without the support of the stakeholders. Accordingly, Board examinations and evaluation was conducted successfully with the support and hard work done of the Management, Principals, and Teachers/Staff of all affiliated schools. CBSE expresses warm thanks and extends its appreciation to everyone involved in these activities including Principals, Teachers, Centre Superintendent, Deputy Centre Superintendent, Assistant Centre Superintendent, Observers, City Coordinators, Flying Squads, supporting staff at examination centres and teams involved in evaluation.

As nearly 25 lakh students and 50 lakh parents are involved in the examinations, they all followed the instructions issued by the CBSE in disciplined conduct of examinations. Their support is well appreciated by the CBSE.

As CBSE has schools in 27 countries abroad and the examinations of the affiliated schools situated in these countries was conducted efficiently, hence, CBSE is extremely grateful to the local governments of the countries for extending their untiring support to the CBSE.


The Board is equally grateful to the India Missions abroad who selflessly supported CBSE and its students tirelessly in the smooth conduct of the examinations.
